



The Wedding Garment

Last Sunday and this Sunday, our Lord Jesus Christ is trying to describe to us what the Kingdom of God is like as we see it on earth. It is, in fact, not anything that will immediately make us want to join! Rather, it is a collection of the outcasts of our world. We should never think of the Kingdom as a place where only the good are to be found. Rather, it is made up of us who are sinners, but who are invited to the Kingdom, if we want to be part of it.

The challenge last Sunday was accepting God's call. This week, the challenge is to keep clear of all entanglements so that we may be free to come to the feast whenever the Lord calls us. It seems strange that the invited guests in the parable do not want to come to the feast. But do they not recognize what it is that they are turning down? This can also happen to us, so we need to be alert. So often in the Gospels Jesus admonishes us to be alert, to be on the lookout, to keep vigil, because the Kingdom can come among us at any time.

Perhaps too often we think that Jesus is referring to the end of the world. Instead, quite likely, he is referring to the opportunities that we have each and every day to live the joy of the Kingdom in our love for others.

The first reading from the Prophet Isaiah talks about how God himself will prepare a banquet for us. The imagery is wonderful, indeed delicious! And further, God will wipe away all tears. This is surely a sign that the people who are invited to the banquet are those who are sad and suffering. The suffering that matters in this life is the suffering that is inevitable as we try to love all others and try not to put our own interests first.

The second reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians wants us to understand that Jesus is not telling us that life is only about suffering. St. Paul recognizes that, in every circumstance and in all things, he has learned what it feels like to be well fed and to go hungry, to live in abundance and to be in need.

So also, we must experience how to live in abundance and to love others, and we need to know how to have nothing and to love others. Life is about loving others, and we must do whatever it takes to love others. Jesus tells us to love our enemies as ourselves. Jesus explains to us that the commandment that counts is to love God and to love others.

Returning to the Gospel of St. Matthew, we realize that Jesus is calling and inviting everyone to come to the feast, to celebrate in the Kingdom. That call, that invitation is extended now, it is happening right now, in the life of each one of us. How will we respond? The best response to this call, the best acceptance of this invitation is to love others, no matter how difficult it is. Our wedding garment is and must be love.

Empowering Our Parish Vision


Each year, Project Advance inspires us to come together as a community of faith in Jesus Christ to support various ministries and programs of the Archdiocese and in our parishes.

The marble ambo will complement our marble altar in design, detail, and proportion. The total estimate for all components of this project – materials, construction, installation, and labour – is \$27,000.
