



The Things that Are God's

On this Sunday, Jesus invites us to become more aware of the workings of God in all of us and in the events of our lives. We should never narrow our vision simply to that which is considered to be holy and of God by our Church, by our society, or by our friends. God transcends all and everything. God is present in all and everything. And in this openness, we are still invited to believe that Christ is present in his Church and in the teachings of his Church.

In the first reading, the Prophet Isaiah speaks of the role of Cyrus the Great, King of Persia, as part of God's plan. Most of the people in the time of Cyrus and Isaiah would not have been thinking in this way. For the Chosen People, they were the heart of God's plan, and other peoples were only in the way. For other cultures, however, there was a completely different understanding of God or of gods. Yet Isaiah is able to see the hand of God in Cyrus, and proclaims that Cyrus is an instrument of God.

The challenge for us today is to see everything that happens as part of God's design. God is God! All things happen according to his design and plan. Even when we rebel directly against him, he is able to include our rebellion creatively in his plan. leaving us with the possibility of a new good. Even the best of theologians of all traditions have not been able to explain completely how our human free will and God's will intersect and act on each other.

Faith in God and in Jesus Christ enables and empowers us to see the action of the Holy Spirit in all that happens to us, whether it be, from our point of view, good or bad.

The second reading, from St. Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians, reminds us that our Gospel did not come to us in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit, and with much conviction. This is a way of saying that it is not just in talking about God that we experience him. Rather, we want to become aware of and to experience God's power. We can do so by listening to God's word, and by seeing that word in action through history and in the lives of people in our present age, including ourselves. Becoming convinced of God's presence and his action in the world is at the heart of our faith, no matter how weak our faith may be.

The Gospel of Matthew today speaks to us about the relationship of Jesus to secular laws. Clearly those questioning Jesus wanted him to oppose paying the temple tax with Roman coins because it was offensive to the Jewish people. Jesus makes a clear distinction between what pertains to religious belief and what simply belongs to secular culture. This is always a challenge in every age. It is our challenge too.

The challenge of the Scripture readings today, therefore, is to keep our eyes open to the presence of God everywhere, to be aware and cautious that we can turn secular things into religious idols, and to believe that we are called to be free and loving while we serve God in peace.

Empowering Our Parish Vision


Each year, Project Advance inspires us to come together as a community of faith in Jesus Christ to support various ministries and programs of the Archdiocese and in our parishes.

All funds raised that are in excess of the parish goal set by the Archdiocese (\$29,400, plus the cost of materials needed for the appeal) will be dedicated this year to the commission of an Ambo to complete our sanctuary. The marble ambo will complement our marble altar in design, detail, and proportion. The total estimate for all components of this project – materials, construction, installation, and labour – is \$27,000.
