

Christ our King

The whole notion of Christ as King seems less acceptable in many nations and cultures today. Much of this rejection of the image of Christ the King arises from the modern-day rejection of kingship and kingdoms in general. On the other hand, it is difficult to find a common term that describes those individuals who lead various countries. We would smile, for example, if we were to be proposed a Solemnity of Christ the Leader, or a Solemnity of Christ the President!

What we are called to recognize in this solemnity is that whatever form leadership takes today, Jesus Christ is the ultimate model of leadership. Indeed, all true leadership must be based on him in some way. To clarify, we Christians are not advocating a return to kingship as the normal form of leadership in our modern world.

The Scripture readings today describe what true leadership is about. The true leader is the one who consistently seeks out those in his care and tries to do what will really help them. The Prophet Ezekiel compares the people to a flock of sheep. Sheep are notoriously stupid and can also be very stubborn. We are sort of like that in our lives. Yet the Lord comes looking for us and never wants to lose us. A true leader looks after all of his flock, protecting and caring for them.

St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians speaks clearly about the kingdom that the early Christians were expecting. It is manifestly not a kingdom based here on earth but based on the life to come. True, the kingdoms of this earth, the countries of this earth, the leadership of this earth, must all eventually come to Jesus and acknowledge him as supreme. Precisely how that can or will happen, we have no idea. It really must happen all the time, not just at the end of the world. Anything that pulls our societies away from the Lord truly destroys our humanity.

The parable in St. Matthew's Gospel describes what the earthly kingdom is supposed to be like and how we are supposed to live during this earthly life. It is so very simple, and yet it always seems to evade us: Love one another by serving one another – when we encounter others who are hungry and feed them, when we find others who are thirsty and give them drink, when we meet strangers and welcome them, when we see them naked and clothe them, when they are ill or in prison and we visit them. It is all so simple, so easy to understand. And yet we do not live in this way consistently. But is anything preventing us from trying?

May Jesus Christ be our King today. May he lead us to live as he lived, and to love all peoples as he loves them.


