Dear Parishioners,

We have faithfully entered into the 2024<sup>th</sup> Year of the Lord!

During this season of Advent, time does not stop, but rather it pauses and takes a deep breath. Over these three weeks (and four weekends), as we approach ever nearer to Christmas, we will literally see the gentle passing of time in the progress of the Advent Wreath as we light its four colourful candles one successive Sunday at a time.

The circular wreath itself, with no beginning or end and made of fragrant evergreen boughs, symbolizes continuous life, the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life to be found in Jesus Christ.

On the First Sunday of Advent, the first purple (liturgically – violet) candle to be lit is called the Prophet's Candle. It represents *hope*, reminding us that Jesus is coming soon according to the oracles of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the coming of the Messiah and the birth of Christ.

On the Second Sunday of Advent, the second purple candle to be lit is called the Bethlehem candle. It represents *faith*, reminding us of the difficult journey that Mary and Joseph took to Bethlehem and Christ's humble birth in a manger in the City of David. It lights our path as we ourselves prepare the way of the Lord.

On the Third Sunday of Advent, the third pink (liturgically – rose) candle to be lit bears the name of the Shepherd's Candle. It represents *joy*, evoking the nearness of Christ's coming and the fulfillment of God's promise to send us a Saviour at Christmas. It also announces happily that we have reached the midpoint of the Advent season on our way to Christmas. The rose candle radiates its bright light on Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin verb *gaudere* – to rejoice.

On the Fourth Sunday of Advent, the fourth purple candle to be lit has the distinction of being the Angel's Candle. It represents *peace*, the blessing about which the angels sang in their greeting to the shepherds in the fields: "Peace on earth, good will toward men."

This soft, gentle, and holy season of Advent is a precious time of prayerful preparation. We lovingly prepare our homes to celebrate the coming of Christ at Christmas, and we spiritually prepare our hearts to receive Jesus, born in time, born in Bethlehem, born of Mary, born in human flesh as one of us.

A blessed Advent to everyone!






## SPX PARISH CHRISTMAS HAMPER PROJECT
