

### FAITH - LISA MIILLER

- The week of January 18-25 is the <u>Week</u> of Prayer for Christian Unity. Sunday January 21 celebrates the Word of God and reminds us that Scripture is the source of unity shared among Christian Churches. The International Theme for the Week of Christian Unity is "You shall love the Lord your God ... and your neighbor as yourself." This theme calls all Christians to act like Christ in loving the good Samaritan, showing mercy and compassion to those in need, regardless of religious, ethnic, or social identity.
- February 2 is The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord and The Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This feast comes 40 days after Christmas and is also called Candlemas for the custom of using lighted candles in celebration of the Lord's Presentation in the Temple.
- February 14 is Ash Wednesday and signifies the beginning of Lent. Also being Valentine's Day, we must try extra hard to follow the practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving to renew our souls and deepen our faith.
- ADORATION returns on Friday January 12 following the school Mass that day at 9:15 am and will begin at 10:30 am. Adoration will end as usual with Benediction at 2:30 pm



January is **Euthanasia Prevention Coalition** (**EPC**) membership renewal month. Membership is \$25 per year. <u>Https://epcc.ca/product/membership</u>

Health Canada reported that there were 13,241 assisted deaths in 2022 representing 4.1% of all deaths (Link).

The CWL is a supporter of EPC and encourages all parishioners to become and/or renew their membership of this worthwhile cause.

EPC's Goal: To prepare a well-informed, broadlybased network of organizations and individuals supporting measures that will create an effective social barrier to euthanasia and assisted suicide.

EPC is a supporter of a new book that is worth a read. It is thought provoking and provides a view into those who are less fortunate and/or dealing with mental illness and their desire which leads them to exploring **MAID** (Medical Assistance in Dying). Fortunately, Tyler chooses not to go down this path and this book is his recount of his journey to and away from **MAID**. We encourage al to read this book – **Therefore, Choose Life: My Journey from Hopelessness to Hope** – by Tyler Dunlop.
