

Choosing to Repent

In today's Gospel, Jesus sets out and preaches after the death of John the Baptist. He is preaching John's message: "Repent and believe in the Good News, for the Kingdom of God is at hand."

For Jesus, the Kingdom of God is always at hand, just as it is in our own lives. We have a choice to live in the Kingdom or to ignore the Kingdom. Perhaps we can choose to be indifferent to the Kingdom, but in time that means that we come to ignore the Kingdom.

Everything that Jesus does is important to help us understand him and his mission. He is surely the One who comes in the name of the Lord. He preaches repentance, but later he also preaches love. These two preachings are not exclusive of one another. Real love requires us to repent of all within us that is not of love.

In contrast to the preaching of Jesus, the Old Testament reading today gives us the prophet Jonah, who did not want the people of Nineveh to repent. In the short passage that we read today, we hear only the preaching of Jonah and the response of the Ninevites. They do repent and God changes his attitude towards them. Now, we know that God does not change, and that these descriptions are simply telling us that the Ninevites turned to God and were faithful after the preaching of Jonah. God always loves us, and our conversion brings glory to the Lord. We describe this state as God being happy with us.

The reading from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians today reminds us that this present world is passing away. We can say to ourselves that the world is still here, or we can realize that our world is always changing. Let us acknowledge that the more we live in Christ, the more this world passes away because we are moving from dark to light, from despair to hope, from resistance to God towards the love of God.

For our Ordinary Time spirituality, we can look at all three Scripture readings as inviting us to change, to repent, to live in a new way. The choice is ours each day in our ordinary lives. We are free to respond to the Lord and to allow him to change us, or we can choose to resist the Lord. Today again, and every day, the choice is ours. We pray always to choose well, always to choose the Lord.

This year is between January 18th (the Feast of the Confession of Saint Peter) and January 25th (the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul).

Prayer Services will take place at SFU, UBC, Sacred Heart Delta, St. Anthony's West Vancouver, St. Ann's Abbotsford, St. Peter's New Westminster, and the John Paul II Pastoral Centre in Vancouver.
