MARY MACDONALD

A heart of gold, a smile of pure joy, a kindness that extended to all she knew. That was Mary.

She passed peacefully on Friday, January 19, 2024 at 92 years of age.

Mary was a Charter Member of our CWL Council which was formed in 1995.

Mary wanted to share her faith with everyone, and especially with the children at our school:

*An activity she enjoyed was running the second-hand toy table at our Spring Fairs.

*For many years she would arrange for a number of St. Pius X students to help her strip and prepare palms for Palm Sunday. The children enjoyed the experience and were learning at the same time!

*She also was instrumental in having our Council provide an award to a grade 7 female student who exemplified the values of the CWL.

The children loved being around her!

While she was a strong supporter of the CWL, she was also heavily involved in our parish, where she was not only an usher/greeter, but for many years was responsible for organizing the cleaning of our church.

Mary's personal achievements are exceptional.

She held the title of Canada's Top Athlete in both basketball and volleyball for many years. She won a bronze medal in the Winnipeg Pan Am games in 1967. As a proud member of the University of Toronto sports teams, Volleyball Canada, and Basketball Canada, Mary's contributions elevated her to legendary status in the annals of Canadian sports history. She currently holds a spot in the British Columbia Sports Hall of Fame for her many athletic accomplishments, where she rightfully earned her place among the athletic elite.

Further to her passion for athleticism, she dedicated her working life as a Physical Health Education teacher.

In addition to her successful athletic and educational pursuits, Mary was indeed a woman of profound faith - a strong and dedicated Catholic.

Today, we find solace in knowing that she has been joyfully reunited with our Lord in Heaven, her spirit forever at peace.
