Three in One, One in Three

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is at the very heart of our Christian faith. We Christians are monotheists who believe that there is only one God, but we also believe that one God is three Persons. Philosophers and theologians have written and filled libraries with articles, treatises, and books on this mystery – but it still remains a mystery.

For us who believe, it may be better to approach this mystery from the perspective of our knowledge of Jesus Christ. We know Jesus through the Gospels, and through the witness of others who knew him and wrote about him. Our faith is always a faith handed on to us by others, handed down through the ages, but still always in need of being renewed and made personal in each of us believers.

In the Scriptures, Jesus calls God his Father. This should be the beginning of our understanding of the Holy Trinity. Jesus also makes statements in the Gospels that imply that he himself is God. So we have an odd situation here, which is precisely what the people who knew Jesus on earth felt: a human being just like us, flesh and blood, who allows himself to be thought of as God. But at the same time, that human being, that man, prays to God, calling God his Father.

Later in the Gospels, Jesus speaks of sending to his followers his own Spirit. And he also speaks of himself and the Father sending the Spirit – their Spirit.

On this solemn day when we worship the mystery of the Holy Trinity, we begin with Jesus Christ. We must listen to his own words. If we are to accept Jesus, then we must accept his words. He is the one who puts into our minds and into our hearts an awareness that the mystery of the divine is more than simply an unknown God, more than what we had believed in by believing the Hebrew Scriptures. There is still a clear insistence on only one God in Jesus's teachings, and yet he opens up this mystery to reveal a God who is complex while remaining simple.

The Book of Exodus speaks about this God who reveals himself, a God who wants to be with his people. This is a God who knows human beings and still chooses to walk with them. This is a God who is truly interested in people, a God who accepts people with their defects.

In his Second Letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul mentions God, the Lord Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit. This reflects a very early Christian formulation, so let us not imagine that the mystery of the Holy Trinity was dreamed up later!

The Gospel of John emphasizes this basic and almost incredible reality: God so loves us that he wants to save the world, not condemn it.

At the practical level of our spirituality, we Christians are invited to maintain this faith in one God. We are invited to pray to the Father just as Jesus himself did. We are invited to pray to Jesus himself, who says, "The one who sees me also sees the Father." And we are invited to invoke the Holy Spirit to come to us and to give us the inner strength and conviction to proclaim our faith by the way we live.

As we worship the Holy Trinity, it is important for us to recognize that the great witness to this mystery is our lives as Christians. We often stop at our words. But if our lives do not reflect our relationship to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, then our words remain empty.

This struggle to live in our lives what we believe in our hearts is the daily struggle of all who believe in any religion or faith. The spiritual life is an ongoing struggle to make real within our lives the words that we speak about belief and faith.

Let us ask the Father today to help us understand and celebrate his infinite love for us in his Son Jesus. Let us ask Jesus to show us how to love one another. And let us ask the Holy Spirit for the wisdom and strength to live what we believe.
